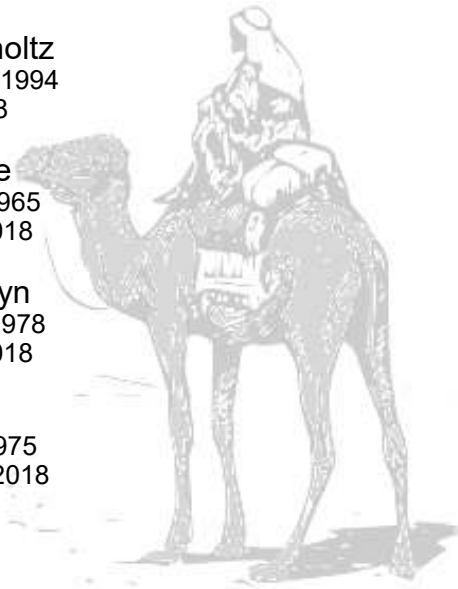

George Sauer 2018 Arab Shriner of the Year

George Sauer was born in Horton, Kansas in July, 1935, the youngest of 4 children, sister Mary Anne, Brother Bob, and sister Wilma.

George actually grew up in Atchison, Kansas, where he attended school, graduating from Maur Hill Academy.

He later served in the Army.

George was married to Cecelia in 1955. Later in 1955 he began a long career, working for Vic Yarrington Oldsmobile in Atchison.

In 1959 he continued to work for Vic Yarrington, taking a position as Service Manager when the dealership moved its operations to Topeka.

In 1966 George and Cecelia joined the Shawnee Country Club, where he became a very prominent member, holding various board positions over the years, including the office of President.

In 1968, the family adopted their son Matt and adopted their daughter Susan in 1970. The family was heavily involved in swimming, and at certain times the family would travel to the swim meet locations. While the kids were participating in the various races, he would volunteer to be the starter and / or announcer, remaining involved with the various clubs and associations over the years.

Our Shriner of the Year later retired from Vic Yarrington Oldsmobile in 2005, after more than 50 years of customer service.

In 2012, he joined the Masonic Lodge in Mayetta and Arab Shrine. He is a member of the Golfers Unit, the Greeters Unit, and the Hospital Dads. George has made many trips to our St. Louis Shriners Hospital for Children.

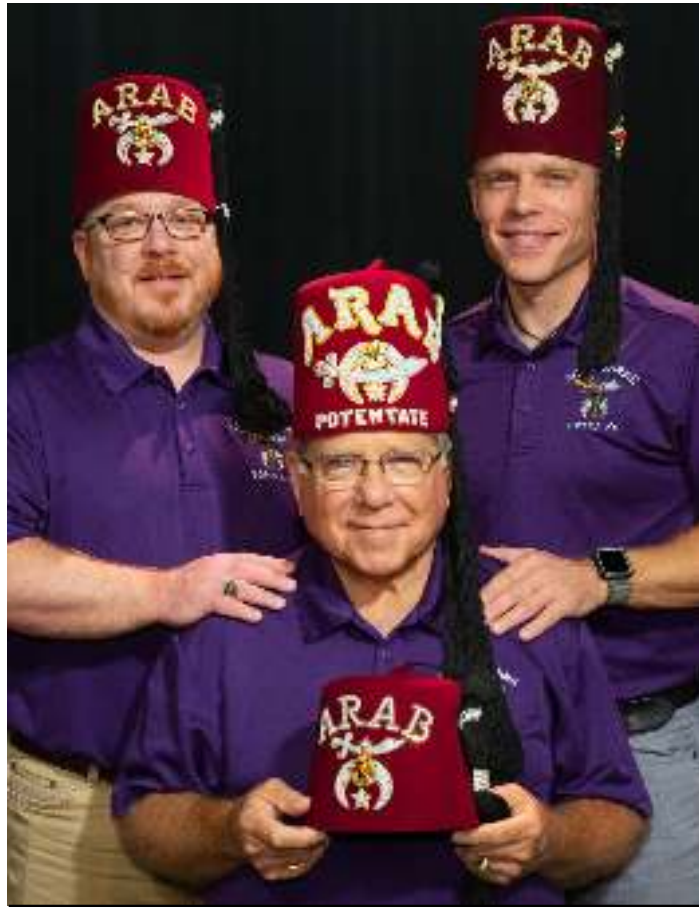

Trap and Skeet clay targets are thrown from standard distances with very little variance in distance, speed, and angles. However both Trap and Skeet are games of consistency and concentration.
