


Greeters

We are getting excited for another Arab Shrine Circus! We are again working on new ideas to bring a better Circus each year. Each year brings new rewards and we face new challenges; this year will be no different. The 2022 event, we had great weather and brought more patrons than we expected; that led to record toy sales on Saturday afternoon.

With a lackluster market place at Imperial Session in Minneapolis MN, I was unable to meet with Jim Hamid this year. James Hamid was traveling the world and did not attend. Again this year Hamid Entertainment Group LLC brought us a great performance. If you did not see the new act, the Chicago Boys, you missed one of the most exciting acts we have had! One of the great things about working the Circus all weekend you have the opportunity to talk to and get to know the performers and the Chicago Boys was a great group of young men. Of course Murphy's Law comes in to play no matter how well you plan. The Hamid's spend many hours and travel time to find an elephant act to bring us. As luck would have it, one of the vehicles transporting the pachyderms broke down in Tulsa! Although they were missed for pre-show rides; they were here to perform Friday night.

One of the challenges we are going to face, as is everyone, is inflation! We are starting to find out that some of our costs are going to be higher. We are being told billboards costs are increasing considerably and the cost to print new banners has more than doubled!

This year we will sell tickets at the Shrine office for our Members only. We have not decided the schedule yet but will let you know in January 2023. Our plan is to have the office open for an extra hour on Stated Meeting night in February 2023 to accommodate those who will attend the Stated Meeting and find it difficult to come to the office during the week days. Watch your Email Blasts.

ADVERTISING!! About 10% of our revenue from the Circus comes from the advertising sales in our program. Over the years we have had members who became unable to continue selling ads or are deceased. At one time the main unit of the deceased member would pick up those ads and sell them. Over the years that process has disappeared and we now have many ads that are not being sold. In most cases all it takes is for someone to ask that business if they would like to renew or upgrade their ad. If you do not have an ad packet, please see Marla in the office and she will provide you with contacts and sales sheets. The sales sheets this year are much improved over the prior ones. In addition to the sizes of ads and the costs, but also the number of comp tickets we will provide to the business. We need the ads into the office no later than 14 December 2022. The sales sheet also states that we must have a digital copy of the business's ad. The reason for this is for the clarity of the ad in our program. REMEMBER we will not turn away any ad sale, even if the business does not have a digital copy!!

Ill Sir Larry Dain, P.P. will again oversee selling banners. He can always use help. If you don't know how to sell a banner or are nervous about selling a banner, contact Ill Sir Larry and he will be happy to accompany you to that business. Our cost for producing a new banner has more than double this year so we have increased the price of a new banner sale. The price is also on the new price sheet.

Every year we have held a public ticket giveaway for United Way and the Military/ Law Enforcement/ Fire. We will again hold those public events, with one change. Our goal this year will be to hold a separate ticket give away event for Law Enforcement and Fire Department.

We will hold our Circus Remotes again with the Arab Shrine Clowns. In 2020 our remote at the Toy Store had more young families attend than we have ever seen! In 2021 the Toy Store management still had concerns with the lingering effects of COVID. Our plan is to hold a remote at the store again in 2023. We will again gather at Red Robin Restaurant and Pizza Ranch in Emporia.

There will be much more information coming in the next several months. Attend your Stated Meetings and watch the Email Blasts.

We are again looking forward to one of our most successful events again in 2023! Thank you for all of your help with all that we ask of you in preparing for our biggest Temple fund raiser but also, what you will volunteer to do at the circus.



Shriners International has introduced a new procedure for access to your 2023 membership card.

When you renew your dues for 2023 you will no longer receive a sticker for your membership card. Membership cards are going digital!

On your smartphone, the **My FezCard Viewer** will give you immediate access to your digital membership card without the need to carry a physical card in your wallet.



To get your digital membership card, you will download the **My FezCard Viewer** app on your phone.

iPhone: go to the [Apple App Store](#); search for **My Fezcard Viewer**; tap on it to download; double click to install; after it downloads to your phone, you sign in with your Shrine ID and last name. (Be sure that you know your Apple ID/password!)

Android: go to [Google Play](#); search for **My Fezcard Viewer**; select it; tap the install button; after it downloads to your phone, you sign in with your Shrine ID and last name.

Your Shrine ID is on your current membership card. If you do not have access to it, please contact the Arab Shrine office secretary@arabshriners.org or 785-234-5656.

Before you pay your 2023 dues, the digital membership card on the **My FezCard Viewer** app will be gold. When you pay your 2023 dues you will have immediate access to their newly designed, black digital membership card.

For Nobles who do not own a smartphone, the local Temple, Club, or unit can scan the QR code on your existing gold-colored membership hard card to instantly determine membership status.




