
ARAB SHRINE LIL' CHOPS

With some changes we have had to make with our plan to have some electronic ads on the board inside the Stormont Vail Event Center; you will now see traveling electronic billboards for our circus with several businesses sponsoring the ads. Also look around town for our ads on billboards and the electronic billboard at 21st Street and Gage Blvd.

As I have reported at the Stated Meeting and you have seen the email blasts; this year we will sell tickets at the Shrine office for our *Members only*. We are not selling to the public from the office. The office will be selling tickets from 06 February 2023 through 17 February 2023 during normal business hours. We will also have the office open additional hours on 13 February 2023. This night will be our February 2023 Stated Meeting and Marla has agreed to stay later to sell tickets for those coming in from out of town.



A bequest is the Most Popular Way to Leave Your Legacy

Each year thousands of individuals, exercising the privilege to determine the final distribution of their estates, designate that a portion of their assets be sued for the benefit and support of organizations like Arab Shrine. In addition to the personal satisfaction of making a bequest, gifts by a bequest will enable you to make significant contributions that may not have been possible during life.


